



Collecting by David Noyes

Collecting all pieces within a pattern---what might you collect??

As I have said many times, people who collect carnival glass can have a variety of focuses as they collect and those focuses can change a number of times over the life of a collection and I am sure many collections have multiple focuses within the collection. Focus may be a pattern, a color, a shape, a maker or any combination of these. Your focus may be on whatever looks good to you as some pieces just have that "take me home" appeal to you. The piece may fit within your concentration or it just may be that piece that you just cannot walk away from.

At times I see those "cannot walk away from" pieces and in this case it was an enameled pattern berry set that we did not quickly recognize. After a visit to my car to look at my old trusty Doty book at the time, we discovered that the pattern was the Northwood Enameled Apple Blossom pattern. As I recall, no berry sets were known at that time in 2001. We were in a small local shop in my childhood state of Vermont and here sat a complete 7 piece berry set with the master and six smalls all stacked inside each other and covered with quite a layer of dust. Even though there were no known berry sets in Doty's at the time, we bought the set and it cleaned up nicely. It would be many, many years before a berry set sale was recorded in 2022. One or two small bowls sold earlier, but no complete sets, so we had our set for 20 years before the first auction sale was recorded in 2022 on HOC. We fell in love with the pattern and that started my quest for more pieces in the pattern. In this case it made me want to collect all known items in that pattern. Fortunately for me, that "cannot walk away from" piece or pieces was part of a pattern that has a small number of items, only one color, but there is a very limited supply of those items out there. The items are only available in blue glass and only in berry sets, table sets, water sets and their individual components if sold that way. Within the HOC auction history database there are a total of 62 sales of Enameled Apple Blossom sets or set components over the past 11 years. It was 13 years later in 2014 when we purchased our next Enameled Apple Blossom pieces. We managed to piece together a complete table set with the bulk of those pieces coming from longtime friend Doug Siska via eBay. Ahh, 2/3rds of the pattern completed and all I need is the 7 piece water set!! Over the next few years a few sets or partial sets came available but most either had some damage or sold for more than my wallet could stand!! Bought a couple of tumblers during the time, but not much out there. Then in 2022 a complete undamaged set appeared at a Burns auction and looked gorgeous. We decided it was our time if there would ever be a time, so we persevered and ultimately won the set. Twenty one years later and I finally had all known pieces in the pattern. We love the pattern and cherish the pieces as we think it is one of the best if not the best enameled patterns out there in the old glass. The bottom line, if you're wanting to get everything in a pattern, choose a pattern with limited selections but also choose something that has some availability!! Twenty one years is a long time to take to acquire all the pieces in this pattern, but we never gave up and very glad we didn't. There is always a reason to collect, so know your likes and desires and pursue them.


